When prompted for the article type, please select **Original Research**. On the Additional Information screen, you will be asked if the manuscript belongs to a special issue, please choose yes and the special issue's title, **Project Management and Scheduling 2024**, to ensure that it will be reviewed for this issue. Manuscripts submitted after the deadline may not be considered for the special issue and may be transferred, if accepted, to a regular issue.
